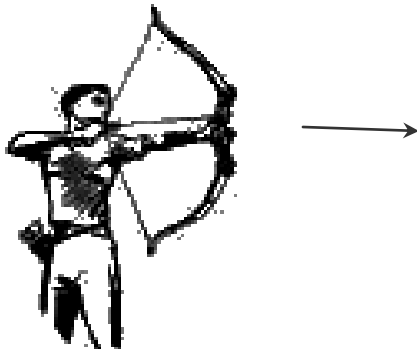


How to Walk

Learning to walk is an essential function. Your character will automatically be set to the walk function when you enter Diablo II.

1. Hold down the left button on your mouse.
2. Drag your mouse in the direction you want your character to walk.



How to Run

Learning to run is an essential function that is similar to walking. The running function is not set when you enter Diablo II.

1. Press **R** on your keyboard.

OR

Hold down the **Ctrl** key.

2. Hold down the left button on your mouse.
3. Drag your mouse in the direction you want your character to go.

Your character will continue to run until you press the **R** key on your keyboard again. Your character will go back to the walk function.



Hot Button:
Press **R** to quickly switch between running and walking functions.



Hot Button:
Hold down **Ctrl** to quickly make your character run.

How to Talk to Other Characters

1. Talk Menu

Box:

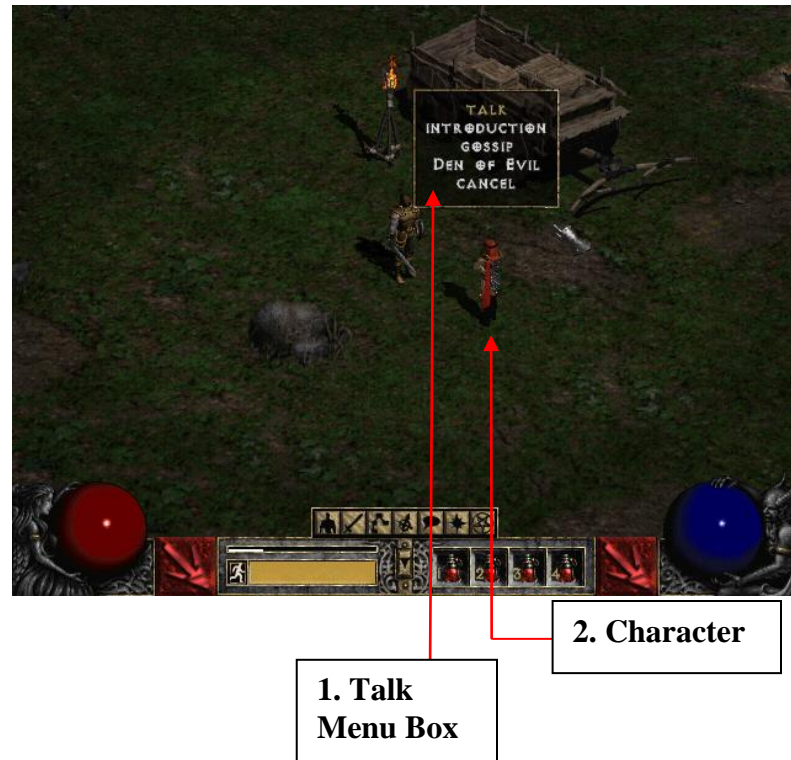
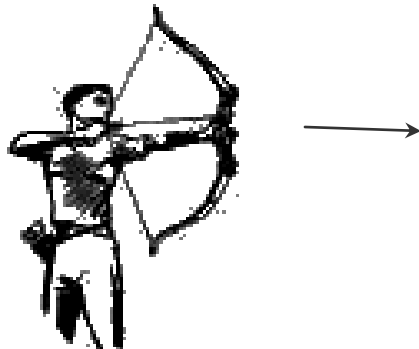
Shows different conversation options.

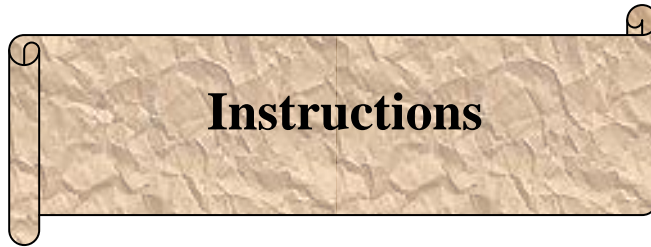
2. Character:

Gives information, rewards, quests, and hints.

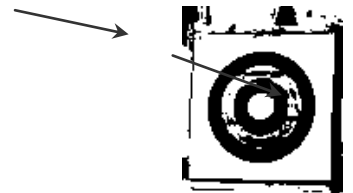
Talking to other characters in Diablo II allows you to progress through the game. They give you quests, rewards, information, and hints.

1. Click the character you want to talk to.
A menu box will appear.
2. Click **Talk** from the menu box.
A new menu box appears.
3. Click the type of conversation you want to engage in.
A dialogue box will appear.
4. Click **Cancel** in the menu box when the dialogue ends.
The original menu box appear.
5. Click **Cancel** in the menu box.
The menu box will close.

How to Move Inventory Objects to your Stash

1. Stash Screen:

Shows items in your stash.

2. Exit Icons:

Closes the screens.

3. Object:

Helps you play the game.

4. Inventory Screen:

Shows your objects.

Your stash is a safe place where you can store objects.

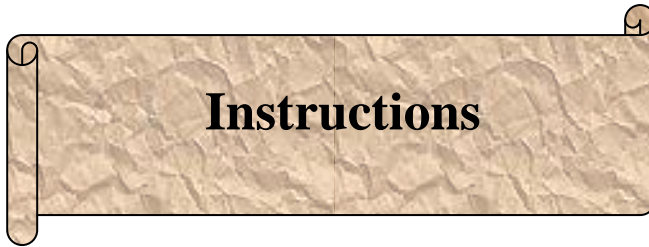

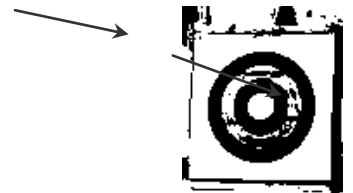

1. Click your **Private Stash**.
Your inventory and stash screens will appear.
2. Click an object in your **Inventory** that you want to move to your **Stash**.

Your item will remain there until you take it out.
4. Click **Exit** in the **Stash** or **Inventory** screen.
The screens will close.

How to Move Stash Objects to your Inventory

1. Stash Screen:

Shows objects in your stash.

2. Object:

Helps you play Diablo II.

3. Exit Icons: Closes the screen.

4. Inventory Screen:

Shows your objects.

To use an object that has been stored in your stash, you need to move it into your inventory.

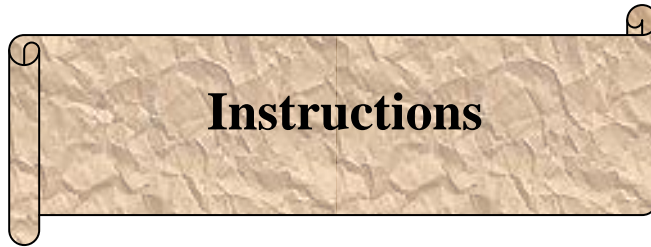

Wandering Around Town



1. Click your **Private Stash**.
Your inventory and stash screens will appear.
2. Click an object in your **Stash** that you want to move to your **Inventory**.
3. Click a square in your **Inventory** where you want your object to go.
4. Click **Exit** in the **Stash** or **Inventory** screen.
The screens will close.



FYI...

If your object does not move, it means your inventory is full.

How to Deposit Money

1. Stash Screen:

Shows objects in your stash.

2. Exit Icons:

Closes the screens.

3. Object:

Helps you play Diablo II.

4. Deposit Icon:

Deposits money.

5. Inventory Screen:

Shows your objects.

You can deposit money into your stash that you have found in Diablo II.

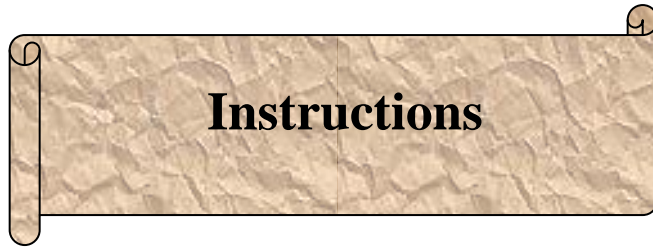

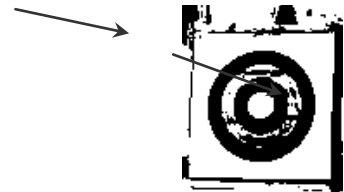

1. Click your **Private Stash**.
Your inventory and stash screens will appear.

5. Click **Exit** in the **Stash** or **Inventory** screen.
The screens will close.

How to Withdraw Money

1. Stash Screen:

Shows objects in your stash.

2. Withdraw Icon:

Withdraws money.

3. Exit Icons:

Closes screens.

4. Objects:

Helps you play Diablo II.

5. Inventory Screen:

Shows your objects.

You can withdraw money that you have deposited in your stash.

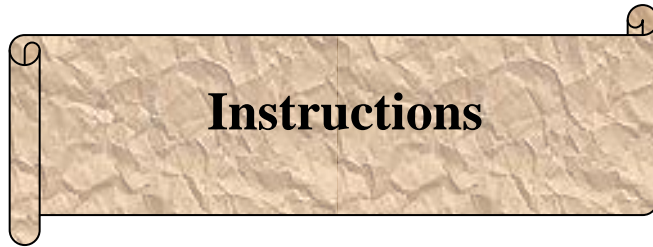

Wandering Around Town



1. Click your **Private Stash**.
Your inventory and stash screens will appear.
2. Click the **Money Icon** in your **Stash**.
A menu box will appear.
5. Type the amount of money you want to withdraw.
6. Click the **Check Mark**.
7. Click **Exit** in the **Stash** or **Inventory** screen.
The screens will close.



FYI...

Don't forget that you can move armor and weapons into your stash as well.

3. Objects for Sale: Shows objects that are for sale.

4. Buy Icon: Buys objects.

5. Trade Screen: Shows objects you can buy.

6. Exit Icons: Closes screens.

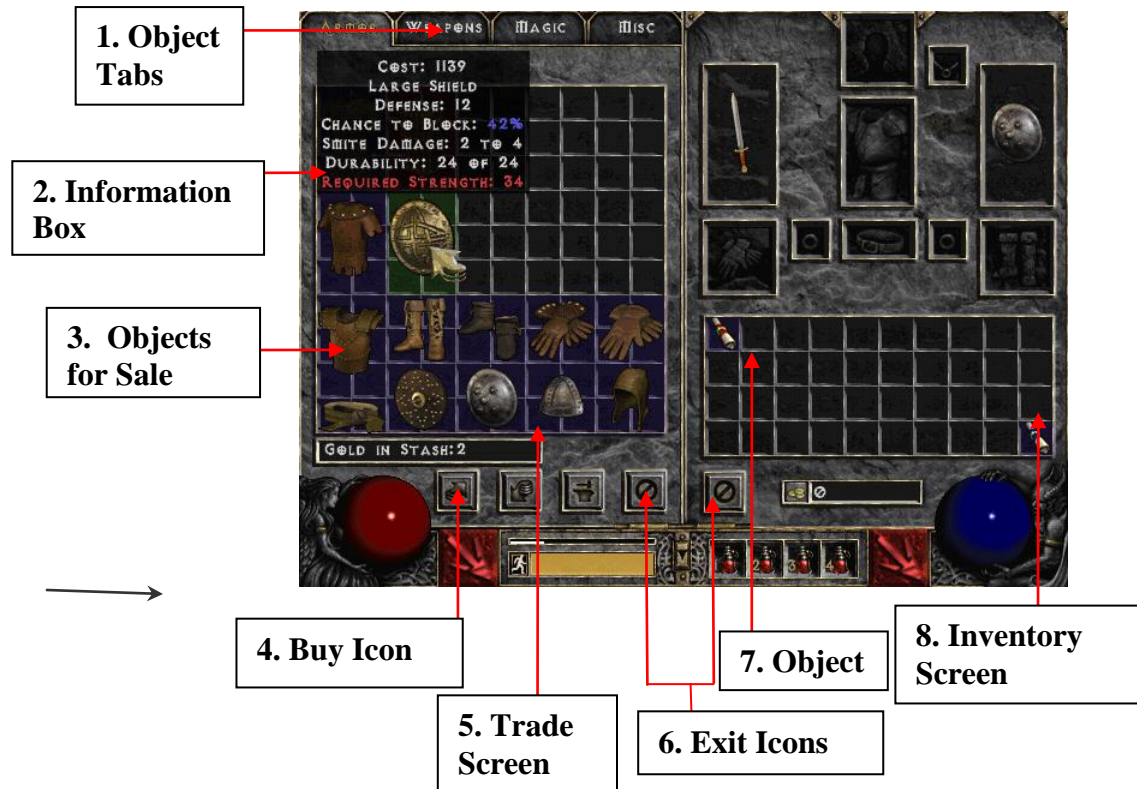
7. Object: Helps you play Diablo II.

8. Inventory Screen: Shows your objects.



Not all characters allow you to buy objects. In the level that you are in, you must find characters that will allow you to buy objects.

1. Click a **Character**.
A new menu box appears.
2. Click **Trade** in the menu box.
Your inventory and trade screens will appear.
3. Click the **Buy Icon**.
4. Place your cursor on top of the object you want to buy.
Information about the object will appear.
5. Click the object you want to buy.
A new box will appear asking if you want to buy the object.
6. Click **Yes**.
7. Click **Exit** in the **Buy** or **Inventory** screens.
The screens will close.



FYI...

Blue objects
can be used.
Red objects
cannot be
used.

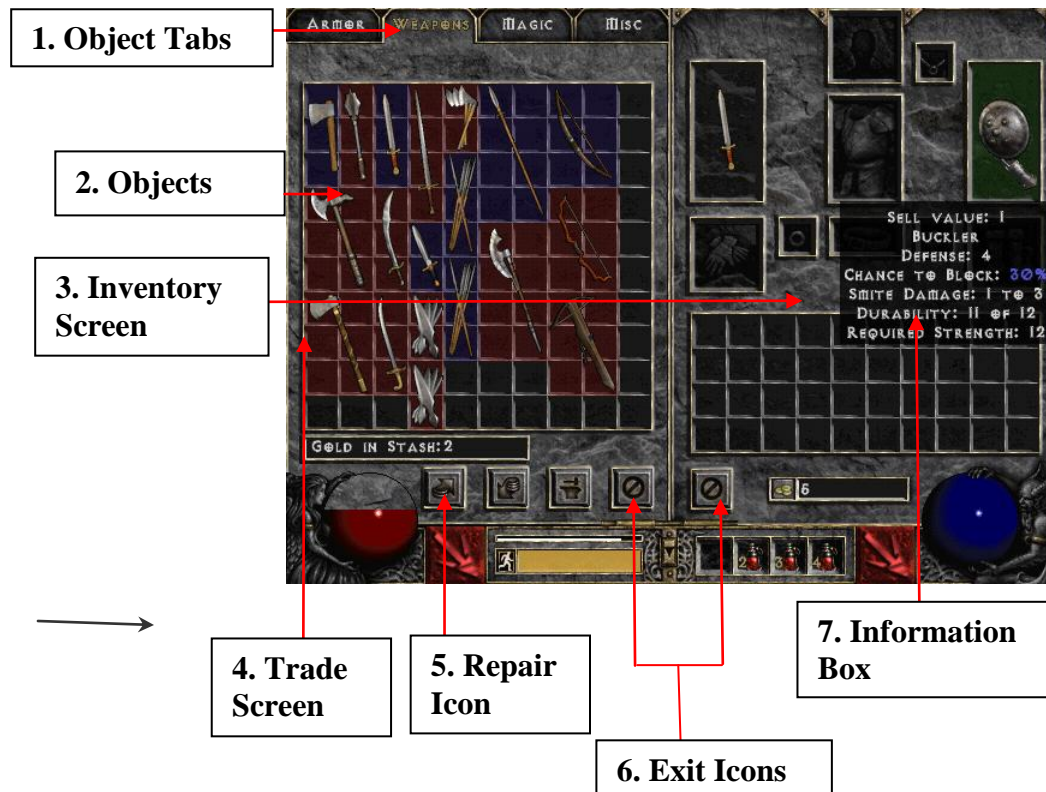

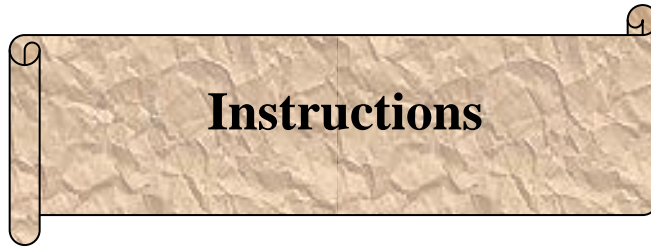

3. Click the **Repair Icon**.
4. Click the object in your inventory that you want to repair.
A new box will appear asking you if you want to repair the object.
5. Click **Yes**.
6. Click **Exit** in the **Inventory** or **Trade** screen.
The screens will close.



FYI...

If the objects are red your character is not strong enough to use it.

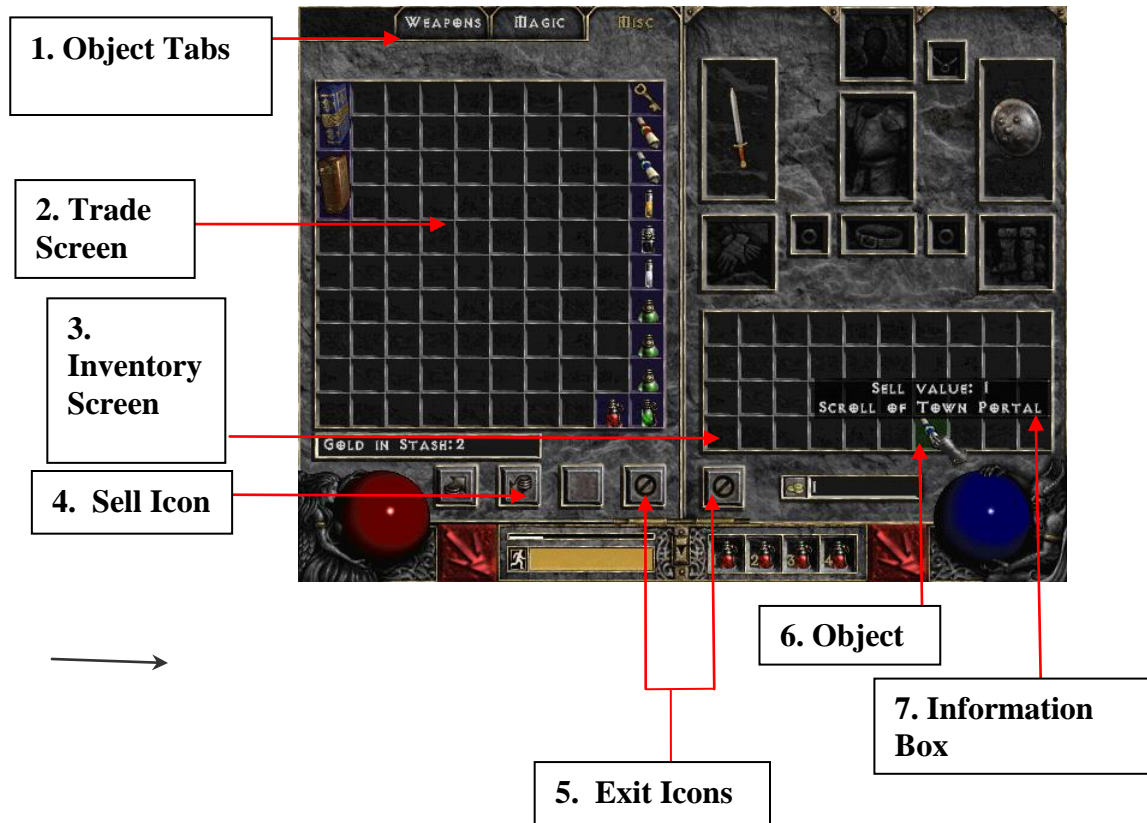

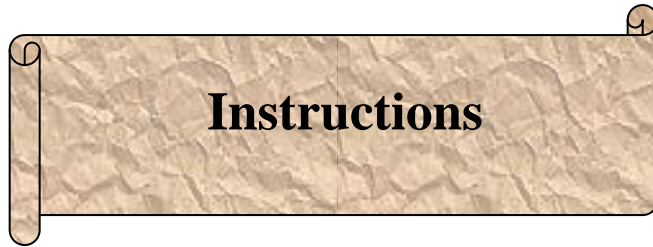

1. Click a **Character**.
A new menu box appears.
2. Click **Trade** in the menu box.
Your inventory and buy screens will appear.
3. Click the **Sell Icon**.
4. Click the object you want to sell.
A new box will appear asking if you want to sell the object.
5. Click **Yes**.
6. Click **Exit** in the **Inventory** or **Trade** screen.
The screens will close.



FYI...
To make selling objects quicker, simply click the objects you want to sell instead of clicking the **Sell** icon first.

1. Act Tab:

Shows which act you are viewing.

2. Active

Waypoint Icon:

Shows active waypoints.

3. Inactive

Waypoint Icon:

Shows inactive waypoints.

4. Waypoint

Screen:

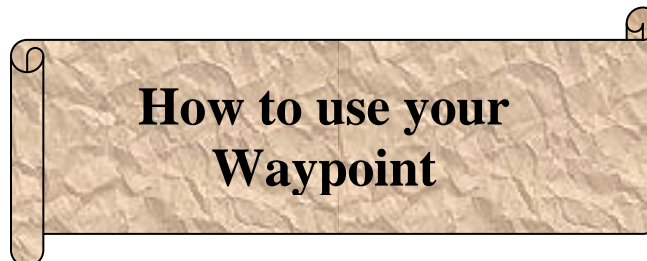
Shows inactive and active waypoints.

5. Exit Icon:

Closes the screen.

6. Waypoint:

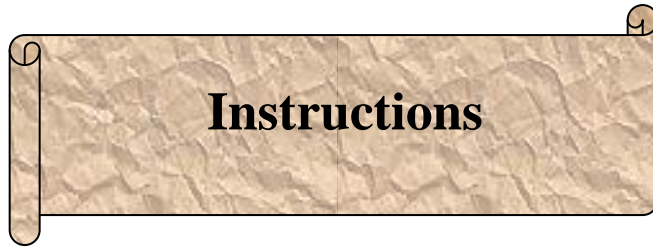
Teleports your character to other active waypoints.



You can use your waypoint to teleport to other way points in Diablo II.

1. Go to the **Waypoint**.
A new menu box appears.
2. Click the **Waypoint**.
3. Click the **Act Tab** you want.
4. Click the **Active Waypoint** where you want to teleport to.

Your screen will automatically close and your character will be transported.

Waypoint:

Teleports you to other active way points in various acts and levels of the game.

Act:

Once a series of quests and levels are completed, the game advances to a new act. There are 5 acts in Diablo.

Active Waypoint:

Waypoints become active when you find them and click on them. Once active, they can be used to teleport.



Now that you have learned to use your character in Town, you are ready to enter the Battlefield.
